Summer Reading for Rising 6th - 8th graders

Requirements:

- Read all summer long! **Daily reading** is the best way to build those reading "muscles." There is one assigned book. Students should also choose other books to read.
- Everyone needs to read the book <u>Wonder</u> by RJ Palacio. It's long, so start early, but it's worth the time. You can read it together or your child can read it on his/her own. There will be **assignments** about the book the first week of school.

Suggestions for Parents:

- Other than Wonder, let your child choose which books to read, from appropriate choices.
- Have a set time each day for your child to read. Creating the norm of family reading time can be helpful for creating a routine.
- Audio books are fun too!
